Remote Learning

- Teachers have now populated Firefly with home learning tasks. Home learning tasks will provide opportunities across all curriculum areas.
- Students can submit work via Firefly. Please ensure you monitor your childrens activity online, ensuring the necessary parental restrictions are in place.
- Once logged in to Firefly, your child should go to their Year group area, through the Students section:



- From here they will be able to find the various subjects which will have 'Remote Learning' or 'School Closure Work' tabs where the work can be found.
- The lessons, at this stage, will not be live so timings can be set to what will suit you best. Some guidelines have been set out on your child's Year group firefly page. Please see the Year 3 example below:

Year 3 recommended subject times

Subject	Allocated time on school timetable
English	5 hours per school week This should include: 30 minutes handwriting practise 30 mins spelling practise 1 grammar lesson 1 comprehension lesson 2 writing lessons, 1 to plan and 1 to complete a piece of writing approximately half to a full page of A4.
Maths	5 hours per school week This should include:
Science	1 hour per school week
History/ Geography	1 hour per school week
Computer Science	1 hour per school week
Life-Skills	1 hour per school week
Music	1 hour per school week
Drama	1 hour per school week
Art	1 hour per school week
R.E.	1 hour per school week
P.E./Games	2 hours per school week
